

City Network for the Lee Kuan Yew World City Prize

The City Network for the Lee Kuan Yew World City Prize Network (LKYWCP Network), initiated by the Centre for Liveable Cities (CLC) and Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA) is an international cooperative network for the purpose of creating and exchanging knowledge in building liveable and sustainable cities. It is also a community of practice for urban leaders and practitioners to collaborate on projects, and to provide opportunities for shaping global dialogue on urban issues.

As signatories, we share the recognition for:

- a) the key role of knowledge exchange in creating more liveable and sustainable cities across the world;
- b) the need to exchange best ideas and practices to enable cities to address urban challenges of the present and future;
- c) the need to foster strategic city-to-city partnerships to create and exchange knowledge between city halls, planning departments, and knowledge organisations

We agree to collaborate bilaterally or multilaterally on various forms of knowledge sharing and capability building initiatives revolving around topics of mutual interest with the intention of:

- a) sharing best-in-class practices
- b) collaborating to find solutions for our urban challenges
- c) supporting each other's knowledge efforts
- d) leveraging each other's knowledge networks

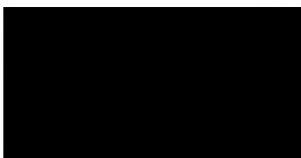
This may take the form of participation in Lectures, Roundtables, Study Trips, Joint Projects, Conferences, culminating in the World Cities Summit and World Cities Summit Mayors Forum.

To facilitate effective and efficient collaboration, we also agree to provide information, enable collaborations, facilitate discussions, and offer support to each other's initiatives. We will also share our joint efforts with an international audience at key knowledge sharing platforms to share our urban solutions, challenges, and successes, thereby enhancing learning and adaptation of best practices among member cities.
